

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

2001 was a year of unity, commitment, compromise and growth within the Alberta Horse Racing industry. The industry-wide activities that occurred in 2001 have laid the groundwork for the industry to properly, effectively and confidently plan for the future.

The year commenced with the Premier challenging the industry to work together to assess its situation and to propose recommendations for breeders, owners, racetracks, the ARC and government to rejuvenate the industry and position it for future prosperity and sustainability.

The Horse Racing Industry in taking up this challenge formed the Alberta Horse Racing Industry Review Working Committee which was representative of all major industry stakeholders.

The "Working Committee" delivered a report to government in June that identified 13 major initiatives required for the industry to move forward. Subsequently the government responded indicating its commitment to "....a vibrant and economically viable horse breeding and racing industry in the province...". It agreed to the Working Committee's recommendation to create a new organization to assume the role and responsibilities of the ARC and it agreed to provide the industry with the needed mechanisms and commitments to allow the industry to manage and promote itself effectively.

I would take this opportunity to thank the industry, the government and in particular the members of the Working Committee for their efforts, vision and support in 2001.

To use a racing analogy the Working Committee and it achievements were the "Feature Race" in 2001, however Alberta Horse Racing's whole card was solid. 2001 saw:

- The first truly significant increase in overall provincial handle in over 10 years. \$147,000,000 was wagered provincially compared to \$135,000,000 in 2000.
- Gross purses in the industry, derived from racing handle and slot machine revenues, rose for the sixth straight year.
- For the first time in recent memory there was Quarter Horse racing on the "A" Circuit at Northlands
- Support for the Alberta Community Circuit continued to grow as evidenced by an increase to 73 days of racing from 65 days in 2000.
- In Marketing the ARC worked closely with the Industry in forming a provincial Industry Marketing Board whose mandate was to streamline and reduce duplication in
- The ARC strengthened its commitment to the Alberta Breeding industry through redefining the purpose of the Development Fund. The Development Fund has been renamed the Breed Improvement Fund with its goal to proactively move towards allocating Fund revenues solely for Breeding and Community support within 3 years.

Horse Racing Marketing initiatives.

2001 has proven that when the industry works together it can succeed and I fully expect this growth to continue into the future.

This will be the final report of the Alberta Racing Corporation. The year 2002 will bring with it a expanded and restructured governing body for Alberta Horse Racing called Horse Racing Alberta. I would take this opportunity to thank all those who have served the ARC over the past five years. As Chair I take pride in the work that the ARC has done during its time and look forward to the continued development of a prosperous Horse Racing Industry in Alberta.

OUR EVOLVING MISSION

MISSION STATEMENT

The following is the Mission Statement adopted by the ARC:

"Acting as a private, not-for-profit agency, the Alberta Racing Corporation (ARC) will lead and enable a healthy, vibrant and progressive racing industry to function in the province of Alberta with high integrity and self-regulated responsibility."

OBJECTS OF THE CORPORATION

In accordance with the Racing Corporation Act, the mandated objects of the ARC are:

to govern, direct, control, regulate, manage, and promote horse racing in any or all of its forms;

to protect the health, safety and welfare of racehorses and, with respect to horse racing, the safety and welfare of racing participants and racing officials; and,

to safeguard the interests of the general public in horse racing.

To accomplish its mandate, the ARC, working with industry stakeholders, will (provincially and inter-jurisdictionally) endeavour to:

link racing industry stakeholders, corporate/private sector participants, and governments, in a racing industry driven partnership;

encourage open dialogue on how the racing industry can maximize its economic (e.g. agri-business) and entertainment potential;

create a platform from which will grow creative and quality racing industry initiatives;

respond to the strategic needs of the racing industry;

ensure that the racing industry is accountable to its participants and the public-at-large;

encourage integration, co-operation and competition to prepare for the challenges and opportunities facing the racing industry leading into the 21st century;


establish a regulatory and compliance framework for the racing industry that is just, reasonable and consistent;

provide objective, professional leadership to the racing industry; collect and disseminate strategic provincial racing information to the racing industry.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

VICE-CHAIR – DONALD R. GETTY *(2003)

A former Premier of Alberta, *Mr. Getty* has a 30+ year involvement in horse racing in the province. He was appointed to the ARC Board in September, 1997 as a public member.



DIRECTOR – GARY BELECKI, Q.C.*(2004)

Mr. Belecki, Q.C. has worked in criminal law since 1970 and currently serves as a Crown Prosecutor with the Alberta Justice Department. He has been involved in the breeding and ownership of both standardbred and thoroughbred racehorses for the last six years and also served as Chair of the Alberta Horse Racing Appeal Tribunal for five years.



DIRECTOR - MICHAEL SECKER *(2002)

Mr. Secker was appointed a new member in October 2000 representing the thoroughbred breeding industry interests in Alberta. He has an extensive 33 year history in thoroughbred racing and breeding (Paddockhurst Stables Ltd) and is an active member of the Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society - Alberta Division.



DIRECTOR - BRIAN BYGRAVE *(2002)

Mr. Bygrave, a prominent Alberta thoroughbred owner and Director of Golf at Kananaskis Country Golf Course was appointed to the ARC Board in October of 1996 to represent the interests of thoroughbred horsemen.



DIRECTOR - GEORGE SEARS *(2002)

Mr. Sears has been a long time owner and breeder of standardbred racehorses and has served in a number of capacities with the Alberta Standardbred Horse Association. He was appointed in August, 1997, as a representative of the standardbred industry on the ARC Board.



DIRECTOR – RON MCLEOD *(2003)

A practicing certified management accountant in Calgary, *Mr. McLeod* also has been involved in the Alberta standardbred industry for many years as an owner and breeder. He joined the Board as a public member to represent The Alberta Standardbred Horse Association in September, 1997.







"A" CIRCUIT HANDLE BY BREED



Pari-mutuel discretionary grants are provided to racetrack operators by the ARC to enhance the development of live horse racing. Generally, licensed racetrack operators who operate more than 25 days of live racing in a calendar year, are eligible to apply. Up to 1% of the individual racetrack's pari-mutuel handle, calculated on an annual basis, is available. The discretionary grant is intended to offset the costs of:

Backstretch Capital Maintenance and Upgrading

Capital Debt Repayment for Racetrack Facilities

Special Uses as Approved by the ARC

MARKETING COMMUNICATIONS

In addition to the Alberta Racing Corporations regulatory role, the ARC has an expanded mandate to promote horse racing throughout Alberta. Our goal is to partner with all racetrack operators to create renewal for the benefit of all racing stakeholders in Alberta. We work very closely with all racetracks in the province to further grow this exciting sport.

The ARC's long term marketing approach has three objectives:

- 1. To further position horse racing as mainstream entertainment to a wider consumer base and the media.
- 2. To ensure a cohesive approach to marketing between the ARC and industry stakeholders.
- 3. To stop the decline in live horse racing handle and to increase overall industry revenues.

In the early part of 2001, the industry initiated a Marketing Board composed of all industry stakeholders to guide the marketing of live horse racing in our province.

The well-respected firm of Calder Bateman was hired to assist the Marketing Board in 2001. Calder Bateman conducted research across Alberta, which included focus groups in the major racing centres. From this culmination of work, Calder Bateman presented to the industry a five-year marketing plan, "Fast Track to the Future, A Five Year Marketing Strategy for Live Horse Racing in Alberta."

The goals of this report are to:

Re-introduce live horse racing to an expanded market of racing enthusiasts.

Solidly position horse racing as a unique entertainment product.

Place live horse racing in the consumers entertainment options decision queue.



The ARC's 2001 marketing strategies were very similar to the strategies executed in 2000. There were three primary areas that the ARC focused marketing communications on:

1. Marketing Partners Programs with Alberta Racetracks

The ARC developed Marketing Partners Program (Partners Program) with all multiday racetracks in Alberta continued. This program provides the racetracks additional marketing funds to attract new fans to their racing facility. It also ensures that the racetracks develop complimentary marketing programs in support of the ARC's branding campaign. The ARC funded numerous marketing initiatives in each racetrack facilities market including; customer loyalty programs, aggressive radio, print and television buys, numerous special events, premier race events, successful family days, media/cross promotions, and community enhancement projects.

2. "The Horses @ Northlands Park" Television Program

This was the likely the most significant marketing endeavor undertaken in the history of Alberta horse racing. In it's third year, the show continued to position horse racing as a mainstream sport. Four industry stakeholders, Edmonton Northlands, the Alberta Standardbred Horse Association, the Horsemen's Benevolent Protective Association (HBPA) and the ARC, combined their resources to produce 15 weeks of live racing events on CTV Sportsnet.

The program was seen across Western Canada (Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba). CTV Sportsnet is also the home of the PGA, NHL, NBA and MLB. Feature races such as the Nat Christie and Fall Classic were seen nation wide .

3. Industry Communications

In 2001, the ARC continued to develop and implement a number of media and public relations strategies in support of the overall marketing campaign. Examples of this included the sponsorship of the Racing Pages in the Calgary and Edmonton Sun newspapers, sponsorship of the "Racing Update" segment on 630 CHED radio, continuation of the ARC website (launched in early 2000) and the development of relationships with various media outlets throughout the province.

AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS

Notes to Financial Statements

Year ended December 31, 2001

1. Authority and purpose of the Corporation:

The Alberta Racing Corporation (the "Corporation") was created as a Provincial Corporation on October 4, 1996 by the Racing Corporation Act, Chapter R-1.5, Statutes of Alberta, 1996. It is a non-profit organization as defined in Section 149 1(I) of the Income Tax Act and is exempt from income taxes. The Corporation is responsible for the regulation of the horse racing industry in the Province in any or all of its forms, and for the facilitation of long-term racing industry renewal.

2. Significant accounting policies:

(a) Capital assets:

Capital assets are recorded at cost. Capital assets are amortized on the straight-line basis over their estimated useful lives as follows:

(b) Revenue recognition:

The Corporation follows the deferral method of accounting. General fees revenue are recognized when received or receivable if the amount can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Assessments, fines, levies and interest are recognized as revenue when earned and collection is reasonably assured.

(c) Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Such estimates include the valuation of accounts and loans receivable and the accrual for discretionary grants within development expenses.

9. Trust funds:

During the year, the Corporation administered Casino Gaming Terminal funds on behalf of the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and the Alberta Standardbred Horse Association. Under revised agreements, the funds under administration at that date, along with subsequent receipts and disbursements of CGT funds, are now administered on behalf of Alberta Gaming. In addition, the Corporation administers funds on behalf of the Alberta Horse Racing Marketing Board, an affiliation of Alberta industry participants. These financial statements do not reflect the receipts and disbursements during the year of funds administered at year end.

10. Contingency:

The Corporation is one of several defendants in a lawsuit alleging a breach of agreement for the building and operations of a new racetrack, interference with the economic interests of the Plaintiff, and wrongfully revoking the racing license.

Management is of the opinion that the claim is without merit; as such, no provision has been recorded in the financial statements. This litigation is in its preliminary stages and the outcome is not currently determinable.
